#### REFLECTION

After his resurrection, Jesus continued to appear to his friends and followers. Through appearing to the men and women who followed him, he encouraged and strengthened them and calmed their fears. On one such appearance, he said to them, 'Peace be with you'. However, one of them, Thomas was not there and so missed the experience that filled the disciples with joy. They relayed to Thomas that Jesus had appeared and had spoken to them, but not surprisingly,

he was neither convinced nor did he believe them. We shouldn't condemn Thomas for his apparent lack of faith but instead we should admire him for his honesty and conviction.

He wanted to meet and experience Jesus for himself - he would not believe what the others had told him unless he could actually put his fingers into the wounds of Jesus.

Later, Jesus re-appeared to the disciples and Thomas was

with them this time. Jesus wasted no time and spoke directly to Thomas, inviting him to put his fingers into the wounds he had suffered at his crucifixion, so that he may no longer doubt. It's the same for us too - none of us go through life without struggles and doubts. There are times when we are at our lowest and weakest for a various number of reasons.

These are the times when we can repeat the words of Thomas and refuse to believe that Jesus is really with us. In fact, Thomas represents the reality of the Church that comes after this first community of witnesses to Jesus. All but

the first disciples of Jesus must believe without seeing. However, just as Jesus was with Thomas, so too he is with us. He is with us when other people reach out to comfort and support us and likewise when we reach out to help and care for others. Jesus is present in us when we gather for the breaking and sharing of the bread. Jesus is with us when we are struggling to believe and when our faith is weak. It is only natural and even acceptable to have some doubts. Jesus did not condemn Thomas for his questioning doubt and neither does he condemn us. What we are called to do is not

Thomas did, during those times when we have our struggles and doubts - the Lord is with us always.

to give in but to have faith in Jesus. So let us turn to him as

## DAY OF DIVINE MERCY

Today is known as Day of Divine Mercy which traditionally falls on the  $2^{nd}$  Sunday of Easter. In his writings and homilies, Pope John Paul II described The Divine Mercy as the answer to the world's problems and the message of the third millennium. The message of The Divine

Mercy is simple. It is that God loves all of us and he wants us to recognise that his mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon him with trust, receive his mercy, and let it flow through us to others. The more we open the door of our hearts and lives to Jesus with trust, the more we can receive. This message and devotion to Jesus is based on the writings of Sr. Faustina Kowalska, a young, uneducated nun in a convent of the Congregation of Sisters of Our

Lady of Mercy in Poland during the 1930s. She came from a poor family that struggled during the years of World War I. She had only three years of simple education, so hers were the humblest of tasks in the convent, usually in the kitchen or garden. However, she received extraordinary revelations or messages from our Lord, who asked Sr. Faustina to record these experiences, which she compiled into notebooks. These notebooks are known today as the *Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska*, and the words contained within them are God's loving message of Divine Mercy. Even before her death in 1938, devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread. Sr. Faustina's Diary sparked a great movement and a significant focus on the mercy of Christ. Pope John Paul II beatified and canonised Sr. Faustina in 2000 making her the 'first saint of the new millennium'. Speaking of Sr. Faustina and the importance of the message contained in her *Diary*, the Pope called her 'the great apostle of Divine Mercy in our time'. Today, we continue to rely on St. Faustina as a reminder of the message to trust in Jesus' endless mercy and to live life mercifully towards others as we strive to become true followers of Christ.

There will be a special celebration at Sacred Heart Church, Chorley this afternoon, **Sunday 7th April at 3pm** with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, the Chaplet, Confessions & Rosary followed by Mass. There are some copies of the chaplet of the Divine Mercy at the back of church, please do take one.
