

REFLECTION

We all know what it is like to wait in long queues or traffic jams, plane departures or deferred appointments and postponed events - all of these are circumstances which can cause anxiety, frustration and impatience in all of us, Even though we know we must be patient because to be in these circumstances is often unavoidable, we still find ourselves searching for a good reason for waiting or to be convinced that the wait is necessary - even more so during these challenging times when we find waiting seems even more difficult than usual. Today is the Second Sunday of Advent and the wait for Christmas is far from over! Today's Gospel tells us that a voice cries out in the wilderness, 'Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight' - it sounds like Advent ought to be a time for road construction and repair not a patient wait for Christmas! It may sound strange, but really preparing the way for the Lord and straightening His path means ensuring that in our lives we are prepared to welcome Jesus into our hearts. So an important aspect of our Advent journey and preparation is acknowledging that there are parts of our lives that need straightening! Examining ourselves, by thinking about our emotional, mental, social, and spiritual well-being helps us in that preparation. When we examine ourselves, we might discover there is clutter or baggage that has been weighing us down. Perhaps that baggage interferes with our feelings and affects our actions. If we forget to do some self-reflection and self-care in preparation for Christmas, could we find ourselves acting distantly with

our family and friends? Even worse, could that clutter or baggage prevent us from celebrating the arrival of Jesus or cause us to not easily show our love for God or our neighbours? As we focus our attention on so many other things during the lead up to Christmas, let us take some

time out of our busy schedules to do some selfexamination and to prepare a place in our hearts to welcome Jesus - then the wait will be worth it!

PARISH NEWS & EVENTS

REOPENING AFTER LOCKDOWN 2 - TIER 3 UPDATE

Following the latest government guidance, Public Worship services have now resumed. Restrictions remain in place include the wearing of face masks, hand sanitisation and giving personal details for track and trace purposes. Social distancing of 1 metre+ will be observed. People who have had any symptoms of COVID 19 should not attend for at least 14 days after the symptoms first appeared.

Funerals will still be permitted to go ahead but should be kept to close family members only (max 30 people).

Burials of ashes can also continue with up to 15 people in attendance. Weddings will <u>not</u> be permitted to take place at this time (except in danger of death). Baptisms can still go ahead <u>but may only be attended by people from the household of</u> <u>the child being baptised</u> (max of 6 and godparents will have to be by proxy).

NB: There is no option in Tier 3 for outside baptisms.

Masses will also continue to be LiveStreamed at the usual times as below.

Weekday Masses: Mon/Wed/Fri - 8:30am Tues/Thurs/Sat - 10:00am

Sunday Masses: 9:30am (Public Worship) & 11:00am (LiveStream)

Devotions will continue to take place on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 1:00pm - 2:00pm and will be LiveStreamed only.

CHRISTMAS MASSES 2020

There will be 3 Christmas Masses this year, <u>Christmas Eve at 7:00pm and 9:00pm</u> and <u>Christmas Day at 9:30am</u>. As the numbers at each service are restricted in line with government guidelines, unfortunately this year these will need to be ticketed events. Requests for tickets must be made in writing stating the number of tickets required, the names of those attending and a contact address and telephone number. Please also state your preferred Mass time and whether you would like to receive your tickets via email, post or collection. Tickets will be allocated to those who regularly attend Mass in the first instance. Those attending must be in their seats at least 5 minutes before the start of Mass.
