Saint of the Week ST. HILDA

Born in 614, Hilda was baptised at the age of thirteen by St. Paulinus of York. Hilda lived as a lay woman until age 33 when she became a Benedictine nun at Chelles in France. She became abbess of Hartlepool and then Whitby which under her leadership became a centre of learning, literature and the arts. Hilda followed the Celtic liturgy and rule, but many houses had adopted the continental Benedictine rule and Roman liturgy. Hilda convened a synod in 644 to establish a single


rule. The synod settled on the Roman and Benedictine version, and they were adopted throughout England.
