REFLECTION

Today's much-loved Gospel teaching of the Beatitudes marks the beginning of Jesus's Sermon on the Plain. For centuries, the Beatitudes have been described as the ladder or the staircase by which the saints ascend to heaven - therefore, if our aim is to join the saints in heaven, then we too must also mount the same rungs. But today's Gospel can also lead to confusion as it is contrary to the 'get ahead' messages we hear in our society today which lead us to believe that happiness means having money, being successful, and having many possessions. In this way, we are not unlike the people who heard Jesus when he taught the Beatitudes as they too

associated happiness with possessions and success. However, the report of the Beatitudes in St Luke's Gospel, goes still further and says that not only will we not find happiness through the 'get ahead' messages of the world, but, relying upon these messages will cause us harm! The warnings spoken are particularly challenging because they suggest that our way of life must change if we are to gain the

happiness of eternal life. But, the Beatitudes are not just

about the rich or the poor, happy or sad, hungry or satisfied, etc. – they go beyond our status in life and refer more to our status before God. Jesus was careful to note that whatever we are experiencing, if it is because of our faith and love of God, we are blessed. The world mainly sees the rich, powerful and famous as the ones blessed, whilst those on the other side are regarded as cursed. But what if those riches, power, or fame are attained immorally,

illegally, or unworthily? Before God's eyes, they are not blessings at all as anything against God's commands is never

a blessing. In the same way, the poor, hungry and the oppressed are not automatic curses – they too may be considered blessings if they were attained in faithfulness to God. Leading the Christian life is never easy, and suffering tests our faith. But we know we can always trust in God's help, mercy and forgiveness. We can say, 'Thy will be done' no matter how difficult the circumstances. For God's will works in bad times and good. It works in ways far beyond our ability to understand, but we can always trust in it.

IMPORTANT UPDATE - COVID REQUIREMENTS

Whilst we can no longer enforce the wearing of face-masks at St Gregory's, it is still highly recommended for the safety of all concerned that you continue to wear a mask whilst in church. Holy Communion will still only be offered under one kind.

I have also decided the following:

- we will not reintroduce holy water as we enter church at this time;
- we will not now be leaving the doors open throughout the service but they will be opened at Holy Communion to allow some air exchange whist there is movement;
 although social distancing is not now required for those who feel vulnerable,
- as a sensitive gesture, a section of the church will still be offered for social distancing . The amount of social distancing will be reviewed on a weekly basis.
