
Saint of the Week

ST. SEBASTIAN 'THE MOST DARING SAINT'

Sebastian was an undercover Christian for most of his life. Born into nobility, he became a soldier who enlisted at Rome around 283 and quickly moved up through the ranks. The emperor Diocletian did not know he was a Christian and made him a Captain of the Praetorian guards. Sebastian spent much of his time encouraging and converting countless prisoners of the Roman army. He was a gifted healerusing the Sign of the Cross—and also converted his fellow soldiers, as well as the governor of Rome. Saint Sebastian was eventually caught and martyred for his faith.. Early representations in art show him being pierced with arrows.

- Reconciliation a process which begins when people try to mend relationships – between individuals or whole countries after times of violence or dispute.
- **Nonviolence** a way of living and making choices that respects others and offers alternatives to violence and war.

A Prayer - "Pour out upon us the power of your love, that we may protect life and beauty. Fill us with peace, that we may live as brothers and sisters, harming no one... Bring healing to our lives that we may protect the world and not prey on it, that we may sow beauty, not pollution and destruction. Touch the hearts of those who look only for gain at the expense of the poor and the earth. Encourage us, we pray, in our struggle for justice, love and peace."
