

# Saint of the Week St. Anthony of Egypt

Regarded as the patriarch of monks, he is the patron saint of Fr. Graeme's former church at Scotland Road in Liverpool, hence close to his heart and all the more important!

Born in Upper Egypt in 251, St. Anthony lived in complete solitude for 20 years in a deserted fort. He left his solitude to guide his disciples who had gathered around him and from his monastery went to Alexandria to encourage the confessors during the persecution of Maximinus. He was buried in an unknown place but his relics were found and brought to Alexandria. He was much loved and is regarded a founder of monasticism and healer of both men and animals. Anthony died in 356.

## **Today: 50<sup>th</sup> World Day of Peace**

Nonviolence: A style of politics for peace

"At the beginning of this New Year, I offer heartfelt wishes of peace to the world's peoples and nations, to heads of state and government, and to religious, civic and community leaders. I wish peace to every man, woman and child, and I pray that the image and likeness of God in each person will enable us to acknowledge one another as sacred gifts endowed with immense dignity. Especially in situations of conflict, let us respect this, our 'deepest dignity', and make active nonviolence our way of life."

Francis goes on to speak about our "broken world" and "a horrifying world war fought piecemeal" and the great suffering this causes, but "violence is not the cure for our broken world..... The Gospel command to love your enemies is rightly considered the *magna carta* of Christian nonviolence. It does not consist in succumbing to evil..., but in responding to evil with good and thereby breaking the chain of injustice."

The message expands fully on such a programme of nonviolence, including historical examples, its domestic roots "it is fundamental that nonviolence be practised above all in families" and pledging the full support of the Church.

"All of us want peace. Many people build it day by day through small gestures and acts; many of them are suffering yet patiently persevere in their efforts to be peacemakers... Nothing is impossible if we turn to God in prayer. Everyone can be an artisan of peace"
