

Saint of the Week

St. Teresa of Avíla (15th October)

Also called St. Teresa of Jesus, she lived in the 16th century, a prominent Spanish nun, mystic and author during the Counter Reformation, and a theologian of contemplative life through mental prayer. She was a reformer in the Carmelite Order of her time and the movement she initiated, and was later joined by Saint John of the Cross. Eventually this led to the establishment of the Discalced Carmelites. In 1970 she was declared a Doctor of the Church for her writing and teaching on prayer, one of only two women to be honoured in this way. St. Teresa is the patron saint of headache sufferers.
