There are many vocations in which people serve the community, but the ones we concentrate on today are vocations to the priesthood and religious life. When I was ordained (a long time ago now!!) there were 481 active priests working in the diocese, with 16 retired. Today there are only 151 active priests (many of them over the retirement age of 75) with 64 retired priests (including our own Canon Firth and Canon Mullen).... those numbers speak for themselves. - The need for prayers is obvious. Have you ever asked your children if they have ever thought of being a priest.... go on, ask them! I wonder do the Schools Career Service ever ask the same question.

And it's not only priests who are disappearing... Religious Sisters (nuns) are few and far between. The FCJ Sisters are organising a weekend for young women who might think of a "vocation" (27 – 29 May). I have some "free" tickets to cover expenses of the weekend which will be held in Kent... anyone interested... get in touch.

The 'World Day of Prayer for Vocations' as it's called officially is also 'a clear reminder that all of us, whatever our status and stage in life, are called by Jesus to become ever better echoes of himself'... have a read of the articles over...
