Baints of the week

SS. John Fisher and Thomas Moore (22nd June)

John was born at Beverley (Yorkshire) in 1469, and died at London on 22 June 1535. He was appointed bishop of Rochester and combined pastoral ministry with study and writing, he was Chancellor of Cambridge University and was made a Cardinal just before his execution. Thomas More was born in London in 1478, and died there on this day in 1535. An Oxford scholar and an incorruptible judge who served as Speaker and Lord Chancellor. A good friend to Henry, he died as he said 'The king's good servant but God's first'. Both were drawn into conflict with Henry VIII over his re-marriage to Anne Boleyn and papal supremacy. Both were beheaded for treason. They are both venerated as men of principle and respected by many beyond the Catholic faith.

Corpus Christi Reflection

The Eucharist - the Body and Blood of Christ, is a mystery with so many layers and a depth that takes more than a lifetime to penetrate. It is not just a thing that we receive however reverently - it is a person, a relationship, a belonging and a transformation that we consume, that becomes part of us: Receive what you are - the Body of Christ.

The readings invite us to reflect on how our celebration of the Eucharist brings Christ's words to our reality: who eats my flesh and drinks my blood, lives in me and I live in him.

The people of the Old Testament had God living in their midst, walking with them on their journey, feeding and nourishing them with the gift of manna from heaven.

Jesus walks with us, not looking on from afar, but journeying in communion with us, living within us, as we eat and drink the gifts he extends from the Last Supper.

And as Saint Paul reminds us, our communion with the One Christ is also a communion with each other: God lives in us as the Church, as we become His Body.
