

Saint of the Week Saint Polycarp

As a disciple of the apostle John, Polycarp (69 - 155) was bishop of Smyrna as well as a friend of Ignatius of Antioch. St. Polycarp is a most important 'link' between the time of the Apostles and the earliest Christian Fathers. As a boy Irenaeus knew Polycarp and praised his gravity, holiness, and majesty of countenance. Polycarp's letter to the Philippians was so esteemed that it was read in the churches of Asia during the lifetime of Jerome. Polycarp suffered martyrdom in the city stadium. When asked to renounce Christ he said;' I have been a servant of Christ for eighty-six years and no evil has come near me; how can I now speak against my king who has saved me?'

Reflection

"Love your neighbour as yourself."

"These are words we associate so clearly with the teaching of Jesus and the way of life the Gospel calls us to. But it may be a surprise to some people to hear that these words come first from the Old Testament, in the mouth of Moses himself.

Moses was instructing the community of the people of Israel in flight from Egypt in their long sojourn in the wilderness. God's instructions were about how that community had to work without grudges, resentment or vengeance, but with love and forgiveness and tolerance.

When Jesus comes with the message of the Kingdom of heaven, it is the same instruction for a perfect, God-guided society, which depends on how each of us lives with others.

The wisdom of this world, which Saint Paul mentions in the Second Reading, will not teach us this: the world will believe in vengeance, and friendship only for your friends.

Each of us must ask how we can embrace the apparent folly of Jesus' teaching:

"But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you; in this way you will be sons of your Father in heaven, for he causes his sun to rise on bad men as well as good, and his rain to fall on honest and dishonest men alike..... You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect."

Must we really aspire to be perfect?
Fortunately it is not all down to us alone, but it is God's love in us which gives us the hope and even certainty that in His mercy we can live up to His standards. For it is written also:

"When anyone obeys what Christ has said, God's Love comes to perfection in him."

So to love, to treat everyone as a brother or sister and not to wait for others to make a move, but be the first to reach out, joyfully, immediately.
