REFLECTION

This Sunday we begin a new season in the Church's calendar - the great Season of Advent. There are two messages that we will hear over the next four weeks. The first from the media will be to move faster, stay busy, queue longer in the shops and spend more money on those 'must have' presents so that we will have the perfect' Christmas. We will be told and sold the idea that unless we buy more and more and surround ourselves with all the trappings of Christmas, we won't be happy. This most definitely is 'fake news.' However there is a very different message and set of values that will be offered to us through the gospels, the prayers and the liturgy of Advent. We are being asked to prepare a way for the Lord, to stay awake, to make a straight path for the Lord and to get ourselves ready to celebrate the birth of Jesus. This is most definitely 'Good News! This is what the call to 'stay awake' means. We are asked not to miss the next four weeks of Advent and to prepare and get ready as best we can as followers of Jesus. It would be so sad, that if after the shopping and all the other preparations we missed Advent and its joyful and hopeful message. In what ways can I prepare a way for the Lord this Advent as I get ready to celebrate the birth of Jesus at Christmas?
