REFLECTION

Now that the celebrations of Christmas have ended. it's the time of year we start to think of new endeavours. It was the same for Jesus, St John's gospel account of the wedding feast at Cana marks the beginning of his public preaching and ministry. 'He let his glory be seen and his disciples believed in him' is how St John describes it. We are his disciples now, but we often fall short in the way we follow him and fail to reflect his glory to those around us. The key message of John's first 'sign', and one of the very foundations of our believing is that God is with us and knows our needs. Israel thought of God as good and loving and caring. A key image of that relationship was that God not only provided food, a basic need, but wine in abundance and freely available, symbolising all that is pleasant and joyful in the world. Wine, in ancient culture was associated with having a party – likewise today, we still bring a bottle when going to a dinner or a party - and

for the Israelites, wine in abundance was seen as a symbol of generosity. The abundance of the best wine symbolises that God is not only infinitely generous, but that his greatest gift to us was his only Son. Like the best wine which only came at the end of a long period of waiting, so came Jesus in the history of Israel. God is generous and loving and wine is a fitting image of his care, but his greatest generosity is sending his own Son to live among us. It is this gift of Christ that we thank God

for every time we gather for the Eucharist and we celebrate his gift in our banquet of bread and wine. Just as Jesus gave wine as his gift to the newlyweds, so too he gives us gifts. St Paul tells us that God gives each of us different gifts so we, too, can be signs of God's goodness and love by using our gifts for the good of others.
