Saint of the Week

ST. ANGELA MERICI

Angela was founder of the Ursuline nuns. Born 1474 near Lake Garda, Italy, she was an orphan. She became a Franciscan tertiary and devoted herself with several companions to the education of poor girls.

In 1535 they dedicated themselves under the patronage of St. Ursula, but took no vows and wore lay clothes. The formal organisation of this sisterhood into a Congregation came only in 1556, as the Church authorities were not prepared to approve, until then, Angela's novel concept of unenclosed and mobile religious sisters.
