Saint of the Week

ST. CHARLES LWANGA AND HIS COMPANIONS

Charles and his companions were martyrs of Uganda who died between 1885 and 1887. This group of Africans, who had converted from paganism, reproached the ruler Mwanga for debauchery and for murdering a Protestant missionary bishop. Mwanga, being bitterly opposed to Christanity, gathered all his pages together and Christians were ordered to separate themselves from the others.

Fifteen did so, all of them only 25 years old. They were later joined by two others already under arrest, and by two soldiers. They were wrapped in reed mats and burnt alive near Kampala.

Then as now, Christians give up their lives

for their faith, both as an example that we value eternal life with God even more than our earthly existence, and also as an encouragement that nothing and nobody can come between us and God.

A Prayer for the victims of the Manchester bombing

'Our thoughts and prayers are with all those bereaved and injured by the cruel, senseless terrorist attack in Manchester. May God grant them strength and courage. Our faith teaches us that even the worst of evils can never defeat love, so we pray that the people of Manchester, all victims, and all of us, from all faiths and none, will discover a renewed unity as they, and we, respond to this atrocity with compassion, dignity, hope and a new Christian commitment to build a more united society.'

The Ascension of the Lord

We can be a bit reluctant to get our heads too much into the heavenly realm because we fear that then we may not be of any earthly good!

Jesus was lifted up, first on the cross and then in his Ascension into heaven. This points to our true dignity and eternal destiny, that in body and soul, we too will rise on the last day. St. Paul invites us to `.. set your heart on things above...' (Col.3:1)

But we can also remember that Jesus' promise before his ascension was that he will be with us all the days till the end of time. This points to his presence with us in the here and now, which allows us to live in the 'already but not yet' fullness of resurrection-time, OUR time.

Preparing for Pentecost

With the psalm we sing 'How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity'. And Jesus prayed that all people may be one, 'May they be brought to complete unity ...' (Jn17:23)This is not utopia, but the will of God, hence it will happen... one day. Unity and peace are gifts of the Holy Spirit.

As we prepare for the feast of Pentecost, let us pray for an outpouring of the gifts of peace and unity in our lives, our homes, our parishes, our world.
