

REFLECTION


The image of a garden is presented in our Gospel today. For those of us who are gardeners, we know that it takes a special set of skills to create and cultivate a beautiful garden and that if a plant is to produce beautiful flowers or abundant fruit, a certain amount of pruning is necessary. In addition to pruning, though, if a plant is to bear fruit it must also receive the proper nutrients. Jesus reminds us of this when he says: 'Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me'. Living a truly Christian life has never been easy. There has always been the attraction of the world and its temptations to make our lives less easy, but for us these difficulties have increased a hundredfold as the attractions of today are multiplied by the increased comforts and pleasures which science and technology

have put within our reach. Human nature, always inclined to choose the easiest way out, has been given so many means of escape from the strain of self-control that even for a fervent Christian it is frequently very difficult to avoid such worldly temptations. Having the ordinary comforts of

life is not wrong - but the natural temptation is to get more and more comforts and riches, and there comes a point where this becomes the only purpose in life. Unfortunately, when this stage is reached, we lose our perspective and God and our future life are forgotten - so

the world becomes our idol and our prison. The temptations put in Jesus's way are multiplied for us. It can be very hard to swim against the current and it is so much easier to allow ourselves to be carried along without effort by the rushing tide – but alas when there are rocks

and currents ahead, those of us who are not strong swimmers may find ourselves in trouble! Our Lord warns us today, as he warned his first followers, to abide in him, to remain closely united with him, as is the branch to the vine, if we hope to bear fruit worthy of heaven. Christ has promised to remain beside us during life if we stay close to him. Whilst we remain healthy branches of the vine, Christ will walk beside us on the road to heaven.

CHURCH REOPENING UPDATE

Following the Prime Ministers announcement of a 4 step road map out of lockdown, and following further guidance received from the Archdiocese, St Gregory's is now open for Public Worship. All previous precautions including social distancing, the wearing of face masks and sanitisation regimes must remain in place. There will also be no toilet facilities available.

The following will apply in Step 2 (from 12th April):

Funerals are permitted to go ahead and can be attended by close family only (max 30 people)

Burials of ashes can also continue with up to 15 people in attendance

Weddings can now go ahead with 6 attendees and are no longer limited to exceptional circumstances

No Baptisms to take place at this time

We will update the guidance re: Steps 3-4 as we progress through each stage of the Government roadmap.
