Saint of the week

St. Peter Claver

Peter lived from 1580 to 1650, a Jesuit missionary who ministered to African slaves as they arrived in the South American seaport of Cartagena. Enduring the derision of the slave traders, he fed the hungry, cared for the sick and the dying, preached the Gospel and baptised over 300,000 converts in forty years. Though his first concern was the salvation of the slaves, he realised that their bodily misery needed attention first. He died of the plaque.

His dedication to those he served is evident in his words:

"We must speak to them with our hands", he said, "before we can speak to them with our lips."



Reflection

Time for creation: Time for prayers for the world and environment

The Season of Creation 1st Sept. – 4th Oct. (Feast of St. Francis)

Christians of all traditions acknowledge creation as a gift from God. This is why we are called to care for and manage it with responsibility.

Current huge flooding in South Asia and Hurricane Harvey remind of the growing urgency of the continuing climate change, and there are many other challenges, such as growing piles of waste and loss of biodiversity. Even if we know there are several causes, we cannot forget that part of the problem is due to our selfishness, lack of care and wide-spread misunderstanding of the world as a source of profit.

Christian faith and respective traditions understand care for creation as part of the Christian worldview, as part of our faith.

'God is in all creatures, even in the smallest flowers', even 'animals are footprints of God', said Martin Luther, and one of the Church Fathers, Maximus the Confessor 'The human person unites the created nature with the uncreated through love'.

'When we speak of "environment", what we mean is a relationship existing between nature and the society which lives in it. Nature cannot be regarded as something separate from ourselves or as a mere setting in which we live." (Laudato Si n. 139, Pope Francis)

The Liverpool Archdiocesan Justice and Peace Commission and CAFOD have produced a new downloadable resource as Pope Francis has asked that Creation Time period be marked with prayer, reflection and action in relation to the Earth and our place in it.
