REFLECTION

Today is Palm or Passion Sunday; the beginning of Holy Week and the climax of our Lenten journey. It is the most important week in the Churches liturgical calendar, a week when Jesus will do and say things that his followers, friends and family will not fully understand. Despite all he did to prepare them for this they did not fully grasp what was happening to him or to them. Nothing could have prepared them for what they were about to experience and have to deal with. Does all this sound very familiar? About this time in many if not all of our parishes, groups of all kinds would have been preparing for the celebration

of Holy Week and Easter- readers, ministers, choirs, altar servers, cleaners, and so many more. Sadly because of the Corona virus, our churches will now be closed for Easter. Perhaps we are not so unlike the followers, friends

and family of Jesus - nothing has prepared us for this current and emerging reality. Three weeks ago if we had been told that our churches would be closed for Easter. we would not have believed it. All that we considered normal has been put on hold; going out to the shops freely, meeting with friends and so much more. So, as we begin this most sacred of weeks how do we enter into prayer and liturgy? At the start of Lent, Jesus asked us to travel and stay with him as he began his journey to the cross. Now, perhaps, we need to find the faith, hope and courage to ask Jesus to stay with us during our time of suffering, pain and uncertainty. We too are experiencing

the pain of Good Friday. Many of us are afraid and worried about our families, jobs and livelihoods. This truly is a time of personal, national and global suffering. How do we have a sense of God being with us during these challenging times? It's very easy to pray when things are

going well, when we are in control but less so when we feel helpless and powerless. But we are not without faith our courage: God is with us. This is Christian hope: not that things will turn out the way we want, but that whatever happens, God is with us - we are not alone!

CORONA VIRUS - IMPORTANT UPDATE

All public Masses, sacraments and other services are suspended until further notice (this will be reviewed regularly by the Bishops). The obligation to attend Mass on a Sunday and Holy Days is also suspended at this time. Exceptions to this are as follows:

- Funerals will take place with restrictions fulfilling pastoral needs.
- The Sacrament of the Sick will continue in extreme circumstances, however, Holy Communion to the sick and housebound is suspended until further notice.
- The Sacrament of Reconciliation can be arranged in extreme circumstances by phoning the presbytery.

The Parish will maintain links with our parishioners in the following ways:

- Masses will be streamed live the times will be as on the newsletter. Please note: we are currently experiencing some difficulties with the live stream at peak times relating to the volume of people trying to access the system. We are therefore recording all Masses and these can be viewed by clicking on the recordings button on the Live Stream page or follow this link: https://www.stgregoryschorley.org.uk/church-livestream
- Outside of Mass, the live stream will focus on the exposed Blessed Sacrament or the tabernacle and cross to help with private prayer.

- A telephone conversation service (ChorleyBuddies) is now available for those who are self-isolating, further details can be found on the Parish Website.

- Although the church will no longer be open for private prayer, parishioners are welcome to pray whilst walking around the church grounds. Please ensure social distancing is maintained at all times and observe that dogs are strictly prohibited in the cemetery areas (except guide dogs).
