REFLECTION

We all take salt and light for granted in our society today, but these commodities were more precious in ancient cultures. Just as now, salt was used in Jesus' time for flavouring, as a preservative, and as a healing agent. Similarly, the widespread use of electricity in the modern world makes us less aware of the value and importance of light in our lives. The imagery presented in today's Gospel is very powerful. Jesus' call to be salt for the earth and light for the world powerfully states our mission as Christians. As Christians we know that if we commit to live our daily lives sincerely by doing good works - feeding the hungry, clothing the naked and consoling those who mourn, then we too are following in Christ's footsteps and showing ourselves to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. But how many of us, can truly say that we are worthy of these honourable titles? In true humility, we can all say that we are far from worthy of any such titles. Yet in all sincerity too, many of us, are doing our little bit of Christ's work, in cultivating our own small comer of His vineyard. Parents who teach the Christian way of life to their children by word and example are spreading the Christian faith. Those working in offices or factories, who show that they are Christians by their honesty, charity and in their respect for God in their speech and actions are spreading their Christian faith. All those who spend in moderation and give help to those who are in need, these are true disciples of Christ. Unlike the salt that has lost its flavour, and the light that is kept under a bushel, the Christian who has previously behaved in such a way can change with God's help (which is never refused!) and can become once more what he ought to be - a life-saver for his neighbour. Our life on earth is short and the demands of our Christian life may not always be easy, but we know that if we live up to

them, we are continuing His great work and are earning

for ourselves the reward of eternal life in heaven.
