#### Saints of the Week

9<sup>th</sup> August - St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross/Edith Stein, a convert to Catholicism, great philosopher and mystic of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, she died in the gas chambers of Auschwitz. 'I am coming to the living faith and conviction that there is no chance and that the whole of my life, down to every detail, has been mapped out in God's divine providence and makes complete and perfect sense in God's all seeing eyes', she wrote. We might pray for her much needed assistance as she is (one of six) patron saints for Europe. 11<sup>th</sup> August - St. Clare, Foundress of the Poor Clares, she renounced all her possessions and aged only 18 became a nun and great medieval contemplative, following St. Francis in total devotion to his ideals of love of God in poverty and praise of nature.
