St. Monica

Monica was born in 332 in North Africa and married to Patricius a pagan of violent temper. She overcame a tendency to heavy drinking and won over both a difficult mother-in-law and her husband with her patient persistence. Her husband was baptised, but died the following year.

Her four children include St. Augustine, who she treated with extreme patience until his conversion, after

which he became a great theologian and preacher, spiritual director & writer whose work influenced Christian thought and the Church more than anyone since St. Paul.

Reflection

Failure, rejection and isolation: these are the themes of today's remarkable Gospel - but they are not all. In the face of them we see perseverance, fidelity and trust. Above all there is an adherence to the truth that is truly amazing. Jesus speaks the truth to all who will listen, and if they find that truth "intolerable" they are free to leave, just as they are free to believe. No one who reads this passage could accuse Jesus of being interested in fame or fortune or the simple accumulation of

followers. He didn't play the 'numbers game'. Even more amazing is that when his followers seem to be down to their lowest ebb, he turns to the Twelve and gives them freedom to go as well. Peter's reply, when he speaks of their belief, is the only answer that matters; it is spirit and life that replies, not the flesh, which

has nothing to Offer.
